TEED UP FOR LITERACY

They don't call it a charity drive for nothing. The saying holds for the United Way Southwest Wyoming Golf Tournament, where in 2022 and 2023, local benefactors and avid golf enthusiasts gathered to "drive" for a combined \$31,846 to empower childhood literacy through Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. This charity enables children from birth to age five to receive a free book each month and experience the benefits and joy of reading.

Event sponsors at the Eagle Level in 2022 included ExxonMobil, First Western Trust, and Mandros. Birdie Sponsors were Amber Kramer State Farm Insurance, ComTech, Genesis Alkali, PowerQuip LLC, and Wyoming Wealth Management, with Par Sponsor the City of Rock Springs. **Funds raised in 2022: \$14,317.**

NG HANDS DAY 2022

COMMUNITY DIAPER BANKS

Imagine the difference even a single box of diapers can make for a struggling household. Then multiply it by—well, a lot. Because that will be the result of United Way volunteers hauling nearly 33,000 diapers donated during the Airstream Club International Rally 2023 in Rock Springs, WY. In fact, it took a van, truck and SUV to get the job done.

But that's not all. Donors also contributed \$12,193 to the Food Bank of Sweetwater County and Community Diaper Bank in 2022. Meanwhile, United Way of Southwest Wyoming was proud to distribute 72,446 diapers to support families and their healthy, happy babies.

For children everywhere, books are a spark of joy, learning and possibility—as well as a catalyst for child literacy and its positive outcomes during the teenage and adult years.

That's why United Way of Southwest Wyoming is a proud supporter of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Through this program and the generous support of our donors, we provide children throughout Fremont, Lincoln, Sweetwater and Uinta Counties, from birth to age five, access to a free book in their mailbox each month.

In 2022 alone, we mailed 31,074 books to serve 3,267 children. Through generosity, we're gifting the magic of reading—from bedtime stories to flashlight adventures to kids across Wyoming.

TRANSFORMING LIVES, ONE HOME AT A TIME

In an area where homeless shelters are scarce, our mission to provide safe housing and essential support is critical. Together with our community partners, we're dedicated to freeing up families' housing resources by offering assistance with food, diapers and utilities. Our goal is to transform lives and foster stronger, more resilient communities.

According to the U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness, in January 2020, Wyoming had 612 individuals experiencing homelessness on any given day. Among them were families, veterans, young adults and those facing chronic homelessness, each with their own unique challenges. IN 2022, OUR IMPACT WAS SIGNIFICANT

The Sweetwater Family Resource Center provided housing and utility assistance to 1,207 clients, immediately improving their overall stability.



The YWCA of Sweetwater County

offered a safe haven for victims of family violence and sexual assault, providing countless nights of secure shelter to support healing and recovery.



The Food Bank of Sweetwater County supplied enough food for 4,037 clients to sustain them for 3-5 days, relieving the burden of food insecurity and allowing them to focus on securing safe housing.



The Youth Alternative Home Association provided shelter and guidance to vulnerable youth, empowering them to make positive changes and create brighter futures.

These achievements showcase our collective power to make a tangible difference. Moving forward, we remain committed to ensuring safe housing for all. Together, we will continue our journey of transforming lives and building a more thriving Wyoming.

The kids loved it. We had six readers at different stations, showing their love of books and putting passion into the stories they read.

In this modern digital age, it is easy for kids to bypass books in favor of screen time. While technology betters our lives and I would not call screen time a "bad" thing, it is essential for kids to develop literacy and reading skills. The fact that these kids, some of which may never have set foot in a library, were exposed to thousands of stories and were able to take home a story of their own (not all households have the funds or desire to buy books) is sure to make a big difference in our rural community. We aimed to not only increase kids' love of stories and creativity, but to help instill the love of reading. Because almost all learning and advancement has roots in reading of some sort, this program is certain to further these kids' education and quality of life.






